In addition to excellence on the field, winners must show characteristics such as optimism, encouragement, servant leadership, compassion, humility, team spirit, and dedication.</p> <p>Trevor Melehan, a Woodstock HS senior and member of its cross-country team, will be honored as Georgia's Positive Athlete of the Year in his sport at the 2017-18 Georgia Positive Athlete Awards at the College Football Hall of Fame in Atlanta in June. Summary Explanation and Background
<p>JROTC member Rebekah Seng was presented the Congressional Award, Bronze Medal on May 1 by Georgia Congressman Barry Loudermilk of the 11th District in a small ceremony at Cherokee HS with her parents and special guests. Only 18 students in Georgia qualified for the Bronze Medal this year.</p> <p>The Congressional Award is the highest voluntary award from the United States Congress that a U.S. teenager can earn; the medals are awarded at the bronze, silver and gold levels. The Congressional Award Bronze Medal requires 50 hours of documented activity in Physical Fitness, 50 hours of documented time in Personal Development (learning something new), and 100 documented hours of Volunteer Service to an organization(s) that serves the greater community. In addition, applicants must complete a minimum two-day exploration/expedition activity that is completely planned and carried out by the applicant-- all within a seven-month window. JROTC Retired Colonel Eddy Stanfill was Rebekah's advisor for the award.</p>

Summary Explanation and Background
<p>Creekview HS rocketry team is continuing its National-qualifying streak, with Creekland MS now joining in as a rare middle school competitor... and Creekview's drone team also is headed to Nationals!</p> <p>Both schools qualified for the Team America Rocketry Contest National Finals on May 12 in The Plains, Va. to compete among the 100 top teams from across the country in STEM challenges for titles, \$100,000 in prizes and scholarships and the chance to head to Internationals in England in July.</p> <p>The Team America Rocketry Contest encourages students to pursue STEM careers by challenging them to design, build and fly a rocket that meets specific altitude and flight duration parameters. This year's STEM challenge required teams to build rockets capable of carrying two eggs to a target altitude of 800 feet and return them -- unbroken -- in a flight window of 41-43 seconds.</p> <p>The Creekview HS drone team finished fourth at the Atlantic Regional of the UAS4STEM Search and Rescue competition and advances to the National Finals in Muncie, Ind. in August. Students are tasked with building and programming a drone capable of flying autonomously, sending live video, and recording GPS coordinates for objects of interest. This year, the drone also had to be capable of supply delivery (dropping water balloons) to coordinates (targets) captured on the video.</p>

FINANCIAL REPORT

APRIL 2018

General Fund

For the month ending April 30, 2018, the tenth month of the 2017-18 Fiscal Year, the School District's Operating Account (General Fund) has received \$315,677,343 in revenue (year-to-date) consisting of state funds of \$140,837,947 (68% of budget), \$156,717,183 local taxes (97% of budgeted amount), and other funds of \$18,122,213 (102% of budget). All operating expenditures of \$299,411,056 (78% of budget) are within the Board of Education's approved 2017-18 budget.

Capital Outlay

The Capital Outlay Fund balance of \$1,820,156 as of April 30, 2018 reflects proceeds of bond sales for capital outlay purposes less refundings of bonds, transfers from the General Fund, bond issuance costs, and capital outlay expenses paid. The next bond issuance is scheduled for early May, 2018, at which time proceeds will be reflected in the Capital Outlay Fund.

Current SPLOST

For Fiscal Year 2017-18, the Cherokee County School District received \$3,482,968 in April 2018, for the month of March 2018, the 3rd month of 60 monthly sales tax collections for the 2018-2022 SPLOST. Collections received were above projections (detail included) for the month by \$747,087 and above cumulative projections by \$1,279,762. Excess SPLOST collections are added to the Debt Service fund balance as a safeguard against future negative economic conditions, assuring the School District can meet future bond payments.
