APEX Policy – HIGH SCHOOL ONLY

1. I will not access any other student's database nor attempt to turn in their work as my own; to do so will be considered cheating and I may be tribunaled/expelled for doing so.
2. I will not access any electronic database or internet site for assistance during quizzes, tests, or examinations; to do so will be considered cheating and I may be tribunaled/expelled for doing so.
3. I must remain working within APEX during the entire class unless otherwise instructed by the teacher.
4. I will not surf the internet, check e-mail, listen to music or violate any CCSD Internet Acceptable Use Policy while working within APEX.
5. If I am required to do unit work, I must take notes and complete study guides as required. These notes and study guides will be turned in after I satisfactorily complete the unit test. These notes and study guides are mandatory and will be part of my grade.
6. Diagnostics or test-out options may be used only for credit recovery. Any diagnostic that I take will be completed within a class period; i.e. no diagnostic will take longer than 55 minutes.
7. Once I start an APEX course I am not allowed to switch back to a traditional coursework class.
8. I understand that the teacher will monitor my progress, and I am expected to work at a pace that is reasonable. APEX courses are expected to be completed within 18 weeks.
9. If I do not abide by any of these rules, a disciplinary referral will be issued. Appropriate action (up to and including withdrawal or expulsion from ACE Academy) will be issued by the administration.
10. Final grades for classes with an EOCT will be based on the following:

NOTE: "FLASH/THUMB" DRIVES ARE NOT PERMITTED FOR STUDENT USE.

**Due to revised NCAA regulations effective August 1, 2010, some non-traditional courses may NOT meet the requirements for initial NCAA eligibility. As such, courses completed on-line may meet graduation requirements in Georgia, but may NOT meet additional requirements set forth by the NCAA for purposes of athletic eligibility.
